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From the Principal

Uncertain Times. As the coronavirus continues to cause havoc across the world we are preparing for the possibility of closing. The school has met with the department cleaners and instructed the cleaners to ensure all surfaces are wiped clean, soap containers are kept full and that all DET protocols are followed.

I have informed parents and caregivers of all DET updates and continue to monitor the updates. The school has placed antibacterial gel pumps, posters and information around the school. Teachers have been briefed and have been preparing work for students for home in case the school is instructed to close.



However, it is business as usual at school and much has been happening.

It has been a busy few weeks and Term One is at full speed. Our students have been focusing on Literacy and Numeracy in the classroom, while our teachers have been doing professional learning to support our AIP Numeracy goal of "All students will have improved outcomes Numeracy".

Over the last few weeks, we have delivered three PD's to staff on our Fresh Start Phonics program, how to complete Fountas & Pinnell assessments and an introduction to teaching comprehension. Years 7-10 have used assessment data to group students for phonics and comprehension classes, and teaching has commenced. Teachers have begun assessing students, in line with our assessment schedule.

Our building works continue with the exterior of the main office building being refreshed with a fresh coat of paint and a new hot water boiler has been installed after being out of action for two years. Unfortunately, we had a flood in the kiosk kitchen which damaged the roof, hot water service and ceiling. VSBA have taken control of the refurbishment and will also pay for all costs to rectify the situation. We're hoping to have this completed for our Mother's Day breakfast.

With the term coming to an end, I would like to thank everyone for their ongoing support throughout the term.



- Certificate III in Warehousing

We have also been running regular excursions that provide our students with the opportunity to develop both their independent skills as well as the importance of being able to work effectively within a team. These have involved an Inter-School Sport Competition (Dandenong Stadium), Sailing Program (Black Rock Yacht Club) and Grand Prix STEM Program (Albert Park) as part of their Personal Development Skills. Looking forward to students being involved in more programs and excursions during Term 2.




We look forward to showcasing their work in the upcoming Open Night and Annual Art Show in Term 2.
