

### **Principals' Reports**

#### Paul Newson, Principal and Athina Caravatas, Assistant Principal

Dear Parents and Carers,

Once again we have made it through a difficult term of COVID related challenges. With the support of families and staff following the government recommendations of taking a daily Rapid Antigen Test, we have avoided major COVID outbreaks. I would like to thank everyone for their diligence and perseverance with administering daily RAT tests and following the government reporting guidelines.

It has also been announced that RAT testing will continue in Term Two for the first four weeks. We have provided students with two weeks of daily tests to ensure that students will have enough tests throughout the holiday period and to ensure students return a negative test on day one of Term 2.

To support access to the COVID vaccination program we have also held two separate vaccination clinic days at the school. The clinic allowed students, parents and staff to take the opportunity to either have their 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> or booster vaccination.

We continued to focus on student and staff wellbeing. Staff were provided with professional learning on a number of topics related to mental health including trauma informed practices and sexuality education. The students have been participating in social/emotional clubs within class time and during recess and lunch.

This term we have welcomed back several school events that were previously postponed due to the pandemic.

Our Year 7 and 8 Parents and Carers were able to enjoy a meet and greet morning. Our School Based Apprentice students (SBAT) prepared a delicious array of finger food for our guests. It was great to see so many parents join us for the morning.



We have also held sausage sizzles across the school where the students were able to relax and enjoy some well-deserved social interaction.

This terms curriculum day focused on Respectful Relationship and the implementation of our Instructional Model. Family Planning Victoria provided professional Learning to staff for the teaching of sexual health, consent and body awareness. Staff also had the opportunity to apply the Instructional model to their lesson planning.

We have been diving deep into all our learning areas which has been supported with Professional Development for the Read Write Inc Fresh Start Reading intervention program and Numeracy. This has continued to facilitate creating real and relevant classroom learning experiences.

Our Tutor Learning Initiative has continued to successfully provide Literacy and Numeracy sessions for students in small groups and one-to-one. We were very excited to follow up on questions from students who became aware of the program and requested to be included.

I wish everyone a safe and relaxing break and look for to seeing everyone back in Term 2.

#### Meet our new staff at Berendale

My name is Christine Sheridan and I am very excited to have come onboard as the Berendale School Career's Teacher. This is a new role for me, but I have extensive experience working with a wide variety of students with various additional needs. My philosophy centres around assisting student to become independent and contributing members of their community.



I am currently introducing all Berendale students to the Department of Education's 'My Career Portfolio'. This is a portal where students can record their likes, dislikes, preferred learning styles and any certificates they have received. Students can also use the portal to begin exploring industries and occupations that they are interested in. This allows students to see what qualifications they would need, and also if these aspirations are realistic.

Many of you would have received a permission slip for students aged 15 and over to participate in the Morrisby Interview. This is an online resource where student complete a questionnaire which then compiles the data to indicate where students' strengths lie. This generates a number of careers that could be suitable choices. The world of work is so vast with so many industries and a multitude of occupations, this tool is an amazing resource to narrow down where students could succeed and be happy.

The second part of the Morrisby interview is conducted face-to-face with a trained careers guidance advisor. Together students and the careers advisor develop some goals to work towards their preferred career direction. Please ensure that the permission slips are returned to school as soon as possible so students don't miss out on this amazing opportunity. I am really looking forward to learning more about this process and supporting all of Berendale's students to think about their future beyond school.

I've recently joined Berendale School and would like to introduce myself. I'm Colleen Avontuur and I've lived and worked in South Africa, England and now Australia.

As the schools Inclusion Outreach Coach, my role is to provide coaching, collaboration, professional learning and support through targeted interventions aimed at supporting educators to enhance the learning experiences of all students. 

#### **VOLUNTEERING AT VINNIES**


We volunteer at Vinnies every Wednesday from 9.30 to 11.30.

On Monday and Tuesday we do SBAT Horticulture. We have to wear boots, t shirt, long pants, hat and sun screen.


I get paid every two weeks on a Wednesday.

#### <u>ISS COMMUNITY ART ELECTIVE – Q & A WITH PETE CROMER</u>

Students from Years 10, 11 and 12 that have chosen to do art as their elective this semester have been studying the work of Pete Cromer and will be using him as inspiration to complete their own artworks in a similar style. Pete is from Victoria and has done a series of artworks featuring birds and animals of Australia, as well as some from around the world. You may have seen some of his works printed on mugs, water bottles, tea towels etc in stores like Myer. Here are a couple of examples:





Our students had lots of questions for Pete and wondered if there was some way we could ask him to answer them in person. We emailed the contact on his website and received a response the same day to say Pete would be more than happy to answer our questions. Here are the student's questions (in purple) and Pete's responses underneath.

Which was the first animal/bird collage you created? I think the first collage I did was called "Things with Wings" - an Owl, a budgie & a parrot. It was very abstract and done in 2014

Which one took the longest? they all take time, however some I just get stuck on. As I work on multiples at the same time, some come quickly and then some times the colours just don't work, or I don't "feel" it. If that happens, I will put the piece of art aside and either come back to it or the parts may be used in another piece. Having said that, all pieces take a long time - I don't consider a piece finished until it is stuck down.

How long, on average, do the collages take you to create? As above - depends on the feel of the piece

Why did you choose to create collage artwork instead of a painting? There is a lot more freedom in cutting and painting. I am a messy artist, with painting shapes - I can paint a block and then cut or cut and then paint, either way it gives me a nice crisp edge. It also allows me to play around placing the shapes. It kind of takes the perfectionist side of things away (I don't have to remain within the lines ....!)

What made you choose wild animals? Why not pets like dogs/cats/fish? It is something I may explore one day, but there are so many interesting and wonderful animals in the world, that it's great to bring them to people who may never get to see or experience them. I really am a dog person though!

Why do all your animal/bird collages face to the left? Due to being left handed, facing left is forward! Pete also sent an image of his first ever collage watercolour artwork from 2014.

It was so exciting to receive personal responses from such a busy and popular artist and it is going to be so valuable for the students to use his feedback when they are creating their own 'Pete Cromer' style artworks. Watch this space for the final pieces!











#### **Artz Blitz Competition**

On Friday 4<sup>th</sup> March, some of our students stayed behind after school to participate in this year's Artz Blitz competition run by Kingston Arts Centre. This year's theme was 'Dreams' and students were given 2 hours to produce a piece of 2D or 3D art based on that concept. All of the entries were then delivered to the Kingston Arts centre ready to be displayed in the exhibition which opened on Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> March.

Some of our students were able to attend the opening ceremony and could not wait to see their artworks on display, they were also able to take part in a free workshop; making Mandalas.

We were extremely excited to learn that one of our Berendale students – Lucinda had won a high commendation award for her artwork entitled 'The Amazing Technicolour Dreamcoat'. Last Friday (25<sup>th</sup> March), we invited Felicity Dallimore, the curator at Kingston Arts Centre, to Berendale to present Lucinda with her certificate and prize, as she was unable to attend the opening ceremony. 
