#### **Acting Principal's Report**

#### **Curriculum Day**

Our staff participated in professional development during Curriculum Day with a focus on the School Wide Positive Behaviour Support Program (SWPBS), supporting students with visual impairment and the Maths Online Assessment tools. The sessions were facilitated by our SWPBS coach from the Department of Education. Our Maths leader Jonathon, unpacked the use and analysis of numeracy data collected by all staff to continue to inform their planning and assessments.

We worked through a range of tasks to continue to build our strategies to facilitate positive social experiences for all students across the school. The session on visual impairment, delivered by our visiting teacher for hearing and visual impairment, provided us with a deeper understanding of the essential teaching and learning strategies to assist students with visual impairment.

#### **Excursions and Events**

There have been a number of excursions and whole school events happen across the school including VCAL Merry Day Cake Decorating Class, Science Works Museum, Martial Arts Resilience Program, METEC Drivers Education and Inter School Sport in Softball. These excursions continue to provide students with meaningful experiences as well as linking classroom learning outcomes in Inquiry Topics, Science and Work Related Skills.

The Colour Run Fundraiser was a great experience for the students to participate in and would like to thank all the families for their generous donations. Ann-Marie was pivotal in the organisation of the event and the funds will be going towards sensory equipment and resources to support student learning.

Senior students continue to participate in individual work experience placements including Frankston Police Station, Moorabbin Laundry and Cheltenham Library. Our School Based Apprenticeship students continue to work towards their full certificates in Horticulture, Catering and Active Volunteering. We will be having a celebratory lunch for them in the next few weeks.

On Friday the 11<sup>th</sup> of November, as a school community, we paused to commemorate our service men and women who have served and those who have died during wars and peacekeeping operations. Two of our Year 11 students read the Ode of Remembrance followed by a minute of silence and ending with listening to the Last Post. Lest we forget.

#### **Enrolments and Transition**

There is a sense of excitement, and eager anticipation, about all that lies ahead at the newly merged Katandra\_Berendale School. We have seen an increase in enquiries and enrolments for 2023 across all year groups. Currently we have 14 new Year 7 students enrolled to start their high school journey in 2023. We are very excited to welcome them to our school community.

We acknowledge that starting secondary school is an exciting phase in education. We do of course recognise that along with the sense of excitement, there will understandably be a few nerves for students, parents, carers and guardians alike and we endeavour to ensure that our transition process will help to overcome these.

This year we have 5 planned transition days for our new intake of Year 7 students. There are 4 morning sessions from 9:00-11:00am and the last transition day from 9:00am-2:00pm. We held our first transition day on Tuesday the 15<sup>th</sup> November which was very successful and enjoyed by all the students. The Berendale staff were delighted to meet the new students and engaged them in planned activities which included taking them on a school tour and participating in a fun art activity. We were very proud of our 2 school captains, Leila and Brad, Jasper in Year 8 and Connor in Year 7 who warmly welcomed the students on arrival and walked them to the classroom.

These transition days are very important as they give new students to the school a chance to spend some time getting to know their new school prior to starting full time in January. These days are designed to be fun but informative, meet new classmates and experience some lessons.

I want to acknowledge all the staff at Berendale School for their amazing commitment and organisation during such a busy Term 4 in ensuring our students are given the best opportunities to fulfil their potential and continue to provide such engaging programs to improve student outcomes.

We look forward to an exciting end to the school year which will involve our end of year assembly (Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> December – details to come), Year 11/12 Urban Camp and Year 12 Graduation.

#### PRINCIPALS' ANNOUNCEMENT

We are excited to provide an update on the Katandra-Berendale School (interim name) project. As you may know, the State Government has contributed over \$12.6 million in funding to merge

Katandra School and Berendale School onto the Berendale School campus. This will include 2 new buildings, which will house:

- art and science spaces
- a junior learning hub
- a middle-years learning hub.

These spaces will provide classrooms, resource intensive learning spaces, informal learning spaces, staff areas and amenities. The library will be relocated to the iIntegrated learning centre building. We will also refurbish the existing Block C to accommodate administration space.

School councils and leadership teams across both Katandra School and Berendale School and architects from Kneeler Design and the Victorian School Building Authority (VSBA) have worked closely to create a fit-for-purpose environment designed to deliver a modern education.

We will hold a **school tour** of the Berendale School and an **information session** to share designs and plans for the school at

We got to modify how light travels and is perceived through light -boards, play with snow and it moves and the students' favourite of the day, the vibrating chairs. That allowed them to feel how sound travels at different speeds.

























#### **CODABLE LEGO** (Year 7 & 8)


